## **REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES**

## MAY 17<sup>th</sup>, 2021

### The Call to Order was made by Acting Mayor Paul Bradshaw at 19:01 (7:01pm)

The invocation was given by Joseph Booker and the Flag salute (Pledge of Allegiance) was led by David Lloyd.

The Minutes from the April 19th Regular Council meeting and April 20<sup>th</sup> Special Council meeting were adopted with a motion from Buddy Goins Sr. and a Second by David Lloyd. The minutes were approved by a unanimous voice vote.

- Senator Eric Nelsons response concerning Sewer system assistance
  - Chesapeake qualifies for a 2%, 30-year Infrastructure and Jobs Development Council (IJDC) Loan and up to \$500,000 in IJDC Grant Funds
  - If Chesapeake were to raise its rates 5 ½% (\$3.48) it would qualify for a 1%, 40year IJDC loan fund and up to \$1 Million in IJDC Grant Funds.
  - State Revolving Funds (SRF) funding, Chesapeake would qualify for a 0.75% interest + 0.25% admin fee, 30-year loan and the lesser of 50% of the total Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) project costs or \$1 million in principal forgiveness
  - If rates are above 2% of the Median Household Income (MHI), Chesapeake would qualify for a 0.25% loan + 0.25% admin fee, 40-year loan and the lesser of 50% of the total CWSRF project costs or \$1 million in principal forgiveness.

<u>The Mayor's first order of business was to propose the town buy new signage to</u> <u>place at the west and east entrances to the town and to replace the signage in front of</u> <u>the town hall.</u> As council has previously discussed in making Chesapeake a nicer and more welcoming community to live it. Signage welcoming home the citizens of Chesapeake should be acquired to promote a sense of community pride. By sharing unique qualities about our city within our community, the initiative can spark an interest in potential residents to move to, and community members to feel pride in where they live. This can be the first step in showing community pride within our town.
